Enrollment for 2024-2025 Program Year

Returning Volunteers

Returning volunteers must be an approved volunteer by December 31, 2024 to continue without a break in service. Returning volunteers that do not have an approved and Active enrollment as of January 1st may not actively serve as a 4-H Adult Volunteer until they have completed all requirements and their re-enrollment is approved.

New Volunteers

New volunteers need to complete all requirements and have their enrollment approved before they can begin serving as a 4-H Adult Volunteer and leading projects. They can enroll any time before their project begins.

Youth Members

Youth members who are doing a project other than a livestock market project can enroll any time before their project begins.

Enrollment fees for 2024-2025 are \$77 per youth and \$28 per adult

Fees are payable to your 4-H club. Fees must be received by your Club Leader before enrollment can be approved.

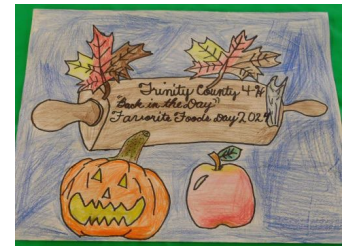

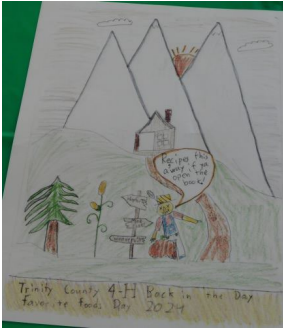

Korson Coulter Livestock Project Scholarship

Application with one letter of recommendation due January 15, 2025

This scholarship is open to youth 9 to 18 years of age who reside in Trinity County and are involved in producing a livestock project for the 2025 Trinity County Fair.

The scholarship is in memory of Korson Coulter. Korson was a 4-H member in Trinity County for six years. He competed in showmanship and market class competitions with turkeys, rabbits and goats. Korson was always eager to help anyone with anything that needed to be done, always there to lend a hand, and always continued to ask questions and learn from others to be the very best at whatever he set out to do.

- \$500 scholarship with a \$100 pay-it-forward payment made to the scholarship fund
- Recipients cannot receive the scholarship two consecutive years
- Funds may only be used to purchase and care for a project animal
- All requirements for the livestock project must be met, and a 4-H leader or FFA advisor must oversee the project

Animal Project Exhibition Requirements

A reminder from the State 4-H Office:

If you plan to show or exhibit your animal project at a fair, exposition or other sponsored event, review the following timeframes in order to meet 4-H eligibility requirements. For more information, see Ch 7 of the policy handbook: [IV. Fairs, Expositions and Other Sponsored Shows](#)

- ❖ **Market Beef:** must be owned and supervised for not less than 120 consecutive days
- ❖ **Market Goat, Sheep, and Swine:** must be owned and supervised for not less than 60 consecutive days
- ❖ **Poultry:** must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days
- ❖ **Rabbit:** must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days
- ❖ **Breeding animals:** must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days
- ❖ **Horse:** must be owned/leased and supervised for not less than 120 consecutive days. Male foals may be shown by 4-H members, but yearling and older stallions are ineligible as 4-H projects. The age of the horse shall be computed on the basis of a calendar year starting on January 1 of the year foaled; it is a weanling during the calendar year in which foaled, and a yearling during the first calendar year following its foaling date, regardless of the year foaled.





National 4-H Thriving Model

The 4-H Thriving model predicts that youth who participate in 4-H programs that provide a high-quality developmental context will thrive, and thriving youth achieve key developmental outcomes.
