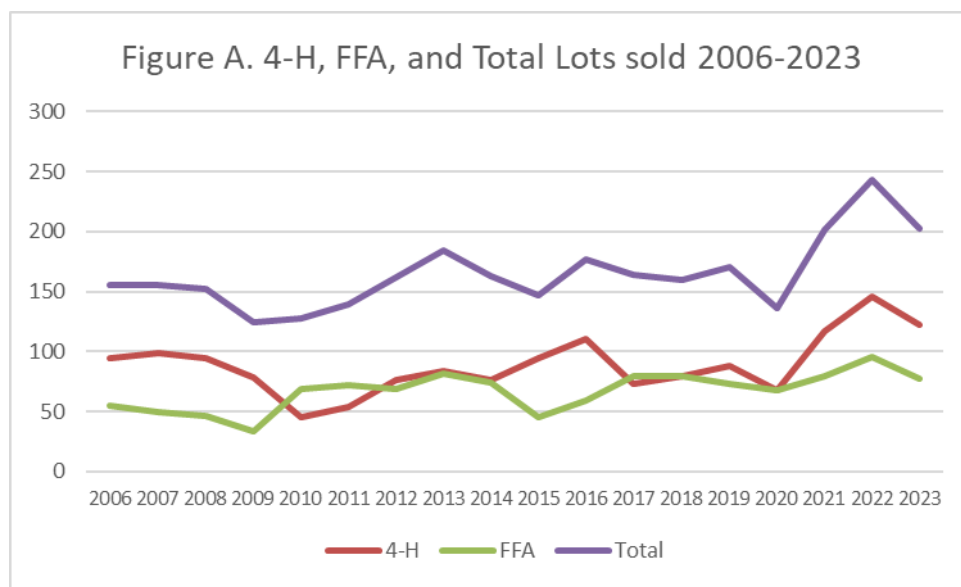
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Article on 2023 Trinity County Fair Livestock Auction

Trinity County Fair Market Animal Project Participation

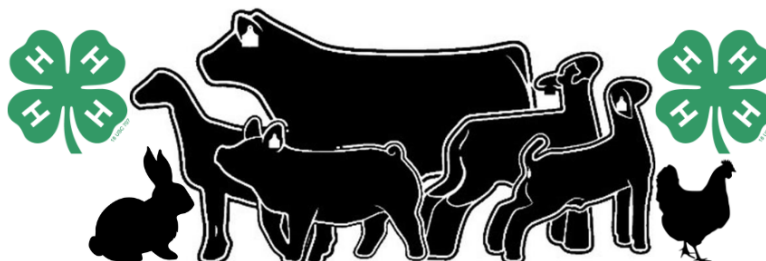

Now that the details associated with the 2023 Trinity County Fair are wrapping up, I started to reflect on the number of youth positively impacted by the fair through the market animal program as compared to the number of youth enrolled locally in 4-H. In the 2022-2023 program year, 72 4-H youth exhibited and sold livestock at the fair. This year's livestock auction participation trended down. At least some of this decline can be attributed to the large number of swine that did not make weight for the auction. Figure A outlines the total number of lots sold at the fair between 2006 and 2023.

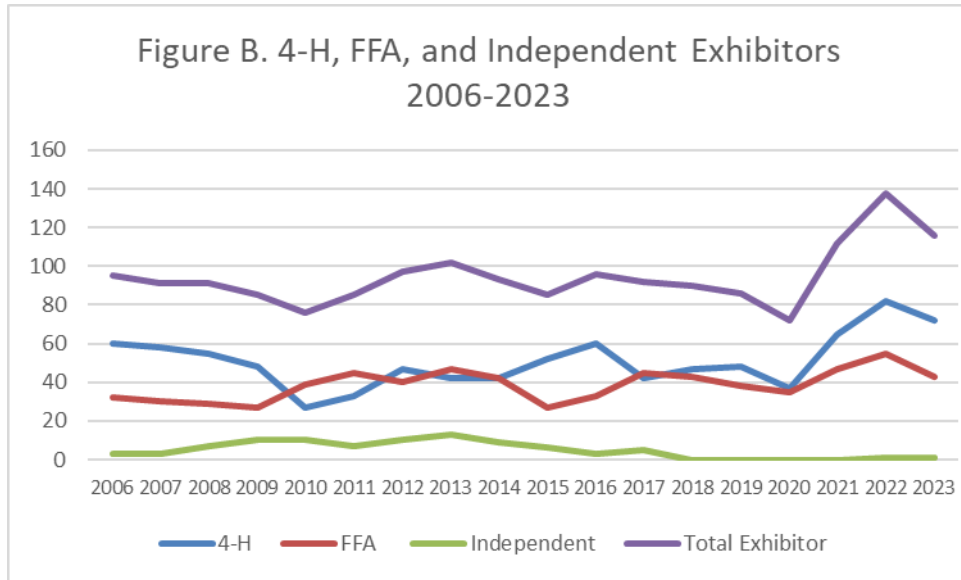


Youth can participate in this program as 4-H, FFA, Grange, or Independent exhibitors. Determining the number of exhibitors is a little challenging in that participants can sell two animals. Exhibitors were only counted once regardless of the number of lots sold. The number of exhibitors trended down this year. Figure B outlines the number of exhibitors.

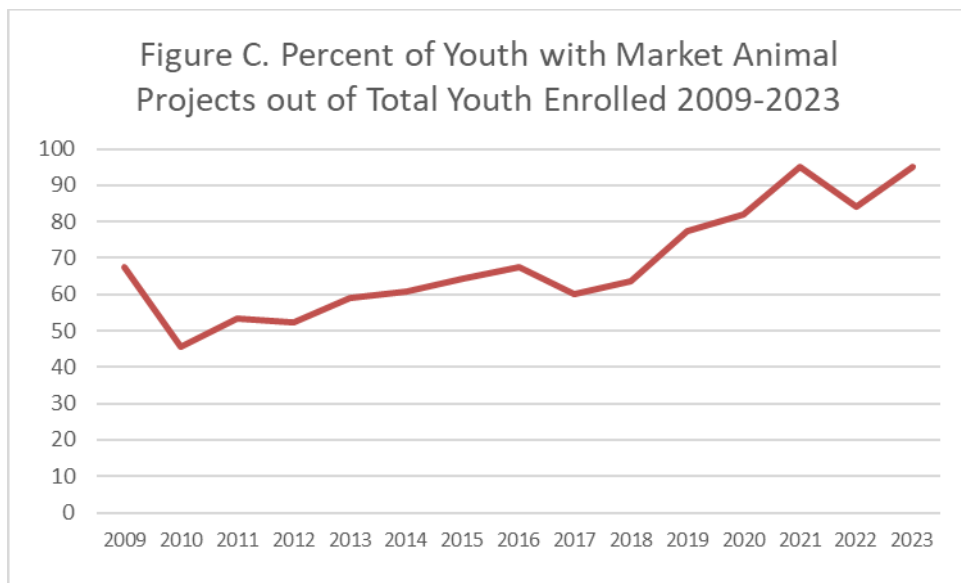
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It is interesting to look at the importance of market animal projects. In the 2022-2023 program year, there were 111 youth participating in 4-H in Trinity County. Of these, 18 were primary members (recall they cannot participate in market animal projects) and 93 were members that could participate in animal projects. Of the 93, 89 members had market animal projects equaling about 95% participation, but only 72 members were able to show and sell their animals at the fair. Figure C shows the percent of youth choosing to participate in market animal projects out of the total number enrolled in 4-H.



This underscores that market animal projects remain an important component of the 4-H program locally and are a valuable youth engagement opportunity. As population and demographics in the county change, we need to understand the educational needs of local youth and look for opportunities to address these needs.

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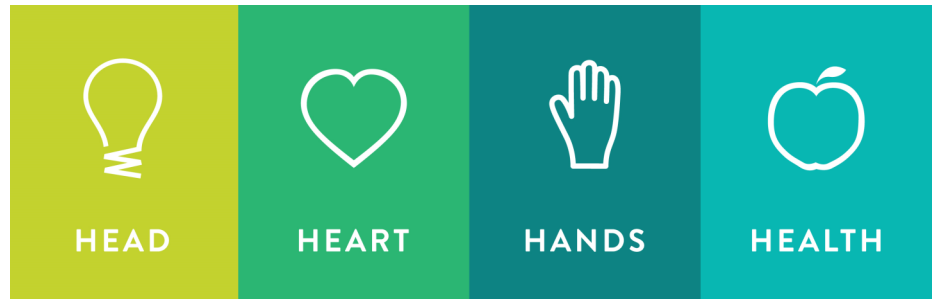
