Families and volunteers should complete enrollment online using [ZSuite](#)

Members who are doing a project other than a livestock project for the 2024 Trinity County Fair can enroll any time before their project begins.

Returning volunteers must be an approved volunteer by December 31, 2023 to continue without a break in service. Since December 31 is a Sunday, completed applications and trainings are **due December 28, 2023**.

For Households that have enrolled in 4-H within the past 5 years, your information has been imported into ZSuite and you can begin with creating a new password to sign in to ZSuite. For new Households or ones that were last enrolled before 2018-2019, you can begin by creating a new account in ZSuite.

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Hayfork Timberjacks 4-H Projects

A report from Hayfork Timberjacks 4-H Club Leader Kathy Johnson on club projects:



In November, our **Arts & Crafts** project members created some Pinecone Critters out of materials grown in Trinity County. We plan to create more art that can be entered in this year's County Fair.

A new and interesting project being offered is **California myPI**. Youth ages 13 to 19 throughout Trinity County may join. It is a great opportunity to learn emergency preparedness skills and gain some community service experience. Some of the topics explored in this project are safety tips, skills when an emergency happens, emergency actions when there is a fire, flood or other environmental challenge, putting together a home emergency kit, handling basic first aid emergencies, putting out small fires, and working with emergency response teams in your local area. The club's **Poultry** project is focused mainly on Chickens and Turkeys, but it is flexible and previous members have worked with ostriches and other less common birds. Whether you are interested in learning more about your home flock birds, chickens/turkeys as pets, showing chickens/turkeys, clicker training your chickens, or more exotic species, this might be the project for you. There is also a STEM/computer project called **Minecraft Madness & More** where members explore various games and learn terms used in designing, building and testing games. Other things members can do are download and experiment with a mod for Minecraft, create a survival challenge then test it on other members, create a build for other youth to play in, and watch a speed run then compare information on what happened during the run. The Leader is Kenny Johnson who has worked with a variety of games and platforms for more than 10 years. He is also the Co-Leader of the Robotics project. 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Korson Coulter Memorial Livestock Project Scholarship

Application with one letter of recommendation due January 15, 2024

This scholarship is open to youth 9 to 18 years of age who reside in Trinity County and are involved in producing a livestock project for the 2024 Trinity County Fair.



The scholarship is in memory of Korson Coulter. Korson was a 4-H member in Trinity County for six years. He competed in showmanship and market class competitions with turkeys, rabbits and goats. He was a champion showman with every species he raised. Korson raised and showed the first Grand Champion Market Goat at the Trinity County Fair. He also held the highest top showman award, Round Robin Champion for both Large and Small Animals in the same year. Korson was always eager to help anyone with anything that needed to be done, always there to lend a hand, and always continued to ask questions and learn from others to be the very best at whatever he set out to do.

- * \$500 scholarship with a \$100 pay-it-forward payment made to the Korson Coulter Memorial Scholarship fund 40 days following the 2024 Trinity County Fair
- * Recipients cannot receive the scholarship two consecutive years
- * Funds may only be used to purchase and care for a project animal
- * All requirements for the livestock project must be met, and a 4-H leader or FFA advisor must oversee the project

Animal Project Exhibition Requirements

A Reminder from the State 4-H Office

If you plan to show or exhibit your animal project at a fair, exposition or other sponsored event, review the following timeframes in order to meet 4-H eligibility requirements. For more information, see Ch 7 of the policy handbook: [IV. Fairs, Expositions and Other Sponsored Shows](#)

- **Poultry:** must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days
- **Rabbits:** must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days
- **Feeder and breeding animals:** must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days
- **Market sheep, swine, veal, and goats:** must be owned and supervised for not less than 60 consecutive days
- **Market beef:** must be owned and supervised for not less than 120 consecutive days
- **Horses:** must be owned/leased and supervised for not less than 120 consecutive days. Male foals may be shown by 4-H members, but yearling and older stallions are ineligible as 4-H projects. The age of the horse shall be computed on the basis of a calendar year starting on January 1 of the year foaled; it is a weanling during the calendar year in which foaled, and a yearling during the first calendar year following its foaling date, regardless of year foaled.



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UC 4-H Achievement Program

The new Achievement Program is active. For the 2023-2024 program year:

- New 4-H members and Junior 4-H members will start in the Achievement Program
- Intermediate and Senior 4-H members can either continue working in the previous Star Rank program & related Record Book requirements or convert to the Achievement Program
- The Achievement Program is an optional program to help members document their growth in 4-H

The Achievement Program has 4 progressions:

- ⇒ iSprout Achievements - for Primary members (ages 5-8)
- ⇒ Spark Achievements - for new members & Junior members (ages 9-10)
- ⇒ Emerald Star I & II - for Intermediate members (ages 11-13)
- ⇒ Impact Star - for Senior members (ages 14-18)

The progressions work together to empower youth by helping them form meaningful youth-adult partnerships, identify what inspires them, set goals, and work towards purposeful and informed change. This is another way in which 4-H equips youth to grow and thrive.

The curriculum library contains books, activity kits, DVDs, VHS cassettes and computer software on topics related to 4-H projects, such as animal care, scientific methods and tool safety.
