This year the 4-H Council decided to emphasize giving to the community as our county wide theme for National 4-H Week. Each club can decide how best to implement this theme. Several clubs will be doing a canned food drive during National 4-H week to help the local food cupboards keep their shelves stocked for those in need. There will be a donation tub available at the Trinity Livestock BBQ for those who wish to donate at that event, which just happens to be at the start of National 4-H Week! Look for the article in the Trinity Journal during the week promoting our 4-H program. National 4-H Week is also a great time to ask one or more of your friends to join 4-H.

FAVORITE FOODS DAY & ACHIEVEMENT DAY will be Saturday, November 13, 2010

at the Fairgrounds Dining Hall in Hayfork. The Hayfork Timberjacks and Southern Trinity 4-H clubs will be co-hosting these two big events. Entry forms and instructions for FFD were mailed to each family in September. Please carefully read, and follow, the directions carefully paying special attention to the entry form deadline for the foods entry form & recipe submission, and the cover contest entry. Favorite Foods Day and Achievement Day are our two most popular county events of the year, so start the year off right by attending. You can count attending TWO county events in section #3 of your PDR by attending this one day! Our members, leaders, and community members come together to share good food, memories of the past 4-H year, and receive recognition of accomplishments. All 4-H members are eligible to participate in Favorite Foods Day. Medals and ribbons are given according to the Danish system, and the 4-H incentives & recognition program. **Entry forms and the recipe for your Favorite Food, and the Cover Contest art entry must be received by the 4-H Office no later than Thursday October 21st at 4 pm.** You may mail, fax or email the FFD entry form and recipe to the 4-H Office. The cover contest art entry must be mailed or brought in to the 4-H Office. FFD instructions & entry forms are also available on the county 4-H website at: <http://cetrinity.ucdavis.edu>. Centerpiece entries can be entered the day of the event. Please read all the instructions for the foods, centerpiece, and cover contest. The theme for Favorite Foods Day this year is **"South of the Border, Trinity Style"**. The theme will apply to all aspects of the day – the foods you bring and the centerpieces. So whatever type of food you bring whether it is a main dish, salad, bread, dessert, etc. - try to have it relate to the theme. If you still have any questions after reading the instructions mailed to your house, please call us at the 4-H Office and we will be happy to help you. **Achievement Day 2010** begins at 1:00 pm immediately following the potluck at Favorite Foods Day. This county event recognizes the accomplishments and service of both 4-H members and our volunteer leaders for the 2009-2010 4-H year. Join us in celebrating a successful year and in welcoming in the new 4-H year. **Record Books will be returned, 4-H year awards given, and recognitions made at Achievement Day 2010.** 4-H members, and adult representatives from each club should be present to receive their awards, and Record Books.

THE NEXT 4-H COUNCIL meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 6th at 6:00 pm in the conference room of the Trinity County Office of Education in Weaverville. Each club should be represented at the meeting by at least one certified adult volunteer leader, and a club-elected teen representative. The 2010-2011 4-H Council budget will be presented and approved at this meeting. We will also be setting the dates for the remainder of the 4-H county events for the year.

MAKING GOALS & PLANNING YOUR CLUB BUDGET

Each fall every club makes their year plans and goals, and then votes on a budget that will help them meet their goals. The club President is the Chairman of the Goals committee and should meet with the other officers, or with the whole club to decide what the club wants to do for the year. Be sure to include community service and leadership activities in your goals! After all the goals and plans are decided, the club Treasurer – who is Chairman of the Finance committee - calls a meeting to plan the budget. The budget will reflect how much money the club already has on hand and compare that with how much money the club needs to pay for activities and expenditures it has planned in their goals. The difference will be how much money that needs to be raised that year. You can then start to plan your fundraisers so you will have an income to offset your planned expenditures. All money spent by the club must be voted on by the members only, and all checks written from the club account must be signed by one adult leader and one member (usually the club Treasurer) who have signature authority at your bank. Club money earned is meant to be spent, and money earned should have a definite purpose before it is earned. **Once you have decided on your club goals and budget, please send a copy of them to the 4-H Office – this is due no later than December 1st each year.** Planning goals and a budget is not an *option* for 4-H clubs, is it required for the kids to learn the skills they should be learning as part of a 4-H club. None of this is expected to be perfect; the kids should just be **learning** how to do it! Eventually they will have the skills needed to run much of the club themselves and handle their plans and finances if they are taught a little at a time. So, club leaders and officer advisors, please help the kids to learn these skills, it will eventually save you a lot of work. Learning to handle money wisely and spend it thoughtfully is an important life skill in 4-H.

CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR TWO EMERALD STAR RECIPIENTS FOR 2009-2010.

Krystin Dionno of Grass Valley Creek 4-H Club, and Cheyanne Noland of Trinity River 4-H Club have both successfully completed an Emerald Star Project for the 2009-2010 4-H year!!

Krystin has created and compiled a binder to illustrate, and teach other 4-H members how to complete a **4-H State Record Book**. Being somewhat of an expert on the subject, having completed 3 state record books herself, Krystin wanted to help other members get over the hurdle of deciding to submit a 4-H Record Book at the state level. This Emerald Star project will be a welcome and useful addition to our Trinity County 4-H curriculum.

Cheyenne has written a booklet and CD entitled "**Swine Helpful Hints**". Her publication covers breeding, health, stock selection, equipment, and showmanship for the swine project. Cheyanne too, is an expert on her topic having bred, raised, and shown a number of prize winning hogs over the years. Her completed booklet and CD have been distributed to the clubs, is on our county website, and is available through our 4-H lending library.

The quality of both of these member's work is outstanding, and they deserve a lot of praise for the demonstration of both their leadership ability, and the desire to create a project that will benefit other 4-H members county-wide. Both girls will receive their Emerald Star Award and county recognition on Achievement Day 2010!

RECORD BOOK JUDGES NEEDED FOR RECORD BOOK JUDGING DAY on October 24, 2010

Each club will need to provide judges for Record Book Judging Day. One judge per every five books that are to be judged is needed. **'Trinideli' sandwiches/salads will be provided for the judges!** All you need is a willingness to carefully look through the record books assigned to you with 2 other judges. On the job training is provided! Thank you for helping out with this important job. **Each club needs to provide judges for their books to be judged at the county level.** Please call the 4-H Office if you are available to help. Thank you.

EMERALD STAR APPLICATIONS FOR 2011 are due to the 4-H Office by January 3, 2011. To earn an Emerald Star, a 4-H member creates a project to carry out during the 2010-2011 4-H year. The project must benefit Trinity County 4-H as a whole. Acceptance of a proposal, evidence of work done, presentation to the 4-H Council, and completion of work, will result in the award of an Emerald Star at Achievement Day 2011. 4-H members who are 13 years and older, have earned their Gold Star, and have been a Junior or Teen Leader are eligible to work on an Emerald Star project. Start talking with your leaders and parents, or contact Audra Lane at the 4-H Office to get ideas for your Emerald Star project. The Emerald Star projects done by members over the past years have been awesome. We would love to see all of our older youth do an Emerald Star project! **To view previous years Emerald Star Projects, and to download an application go to the Trinity County UCCE website at: <http://cetrinity.ucdavis.edu>.**

STATE RECORD BOOKS are due at the Trinity County 4-H Office for review and signature by October 21st and will then be judged at the State Level in Davis in early December. State Record Book judging is for senior members aged 14-19 years old, and is an optional but encouraged activity. Trinity County has had one State Winner, and several Silver Medalists, and Merit Awards in the past. Please see the Record Book Manual – February 2008 version, or the State 4-H website for formatting requirements and additional pages required for entry. If you are interested in entering and have further questions, please call me at the 4-H Office. Krystin Dionno has just completed a comprehensive volume on how to complete a State Record Book for her 2009-2010 Emerald Star Project. Please come visit the 4H Office to view this helpful project.

NEW ADULT VOLUNTEER LEADERS WANTED- the 4-H Program is always looking for adults interested in working with our 4-H youth. As a certified volunteer leader you can lead a 4-H Project, be an assistant project leader, be a club or co-club leader, or be a resource person, or adult helper for your club. There is a 4-H job in your club that will fit anyone's current skills, interests, and time. Please call the 4-H Office if you are interested in filling one of these needed roles in a 4-H Club. You do not already have to be an expert at anything, you just need the willingness to learn. To be a certified 4-H volunteer leader you must fill out an enrollment form and pay the annual fee, pass a background check, and attend a volunteer orientation. New Leader Orientation with Audra will be scheduled by appointment.




2010 Trinity Livestock BBQ

with the \$15.00 Challenge

Do you enjoy shopping? Do you look for great buys? Do you like to check out garage sales, thrift stores, or consignment shops? Have you ever brought your own 'special touch' to an outfit that make it unique and individually YOU?

The \$15.00 Challenge encourages you to:

- Shop in new places with a new perspective
- Be a wise consumer
- Put together a really great outfit!

What you will learn:

- To locate clothing that makes you look and feel great
- To use expert shopping skills
- To find a bargain with high value
- To develop decision making skills
- To interact with the judges and share your windfalls and experiences in 30 seconds
- To communicate with the audience with your fashion show commentary

The rules:

- The spending limit is \$15.00 for a complete outfit. This may include a jacket or vest and should give a coordinated total look.
- Shoes are not included in the \$15.00, but anything else that shows is, including jewelry and accessories.
- Receipts are required, although they can be handwritten from garage sales.
- Sources may include garage sales, consignment stores, thrift stores, Goodwill, Salvation Army, etc.
- 4-Hers must qualify for the state event (SFR) by being the county challenge winner in their County Fashion Revue.

Something to think about: enterprising 4-H clubs may want to have their own garage sale. You can raise money for your club or another worthy organization. You might donate the unsold garments to a homeless shelter, dress for success center, or other locations that help people. Service to others is an important part of 4-H.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

4-H Youth development helps members learn by exploring, by doing, and by receiving feedback. The 4-er:

- learns individually when trying out new knowledge in real-life settings.
- learns cooperatively by having fun while learning.
- learns competitively when work is compared and evaluated by accepted standards.

Some basic principles apply to all learning situations:

- People learn best in an atmosphere of **WARMTH AND ACCEPTANCE**.
- Youth must have **CLEAR, SELF-DETERMINED GOALS**. The ultimate result is most important, not the method used. Sometimes the teaching of skills becomes secondary to individual and group development.
- Each youth will have **DIFFERENT ABILITIES**. The same learning method will not be equally successful with all members. An enthusiastic and knowledgeable leader can impart information in several ways, without becoming repetitive, so that all members will learn.
- Adequate learning requires **MOTIVATION**. Self-motivation comes from basic needs, personal preferences, and feelings of self-worth and belonging. External motivation, on the other hand, is usually based on incentives and awards. Every member can be motivated, but not in the same way, not by the same person, and not even by the same incentive.
- Instruct or show when the **NEED** to do so arises. Do not give too much information: let the young people find it so that they will experience the thrill of discovering for themselves.
- Youth must **ACTIVELY SELECT AND CARRY OUT** the learning activities. Because 4-H members “learn by doing”, they should do their own work, under your supervision.
- **SELF-EVALUATION** is the most meaningful kind of evaluation.
